6. KPU Skills Gap Plan for 2015/16

Lori McElroy stated that KPU has to report how our programming aligns with occupations that the government wants us to focus on. There are 60 top occupations, of which 26 align to our programming, 21 have apprenticeship training that is funded through ITA, and 13 relate to professional programming that we do not offer, such as Engineering and Law.

Moved by Carolyn Robertson; seconded by Jan Penhorwood THAT the Senate Standing Committee on Academic Planning and Priorities endorse the KPU Skills Gap Plan for 2015/16.

7. New partnership with Xinxiang No. 1 Middle School

The resources that KPU would be providing were discussed. KPU will send instructors to China to deliver our curriculum. The students will then be tested according to our standards.

Students have been coming to KPU from China for the past few years. KPU currently has an agreement with another school in China. This agreement would enable the Xinxiang No. 1 Middle School to have a similar arrangement.

It was noted that according to the University Act, Senate has the power to advise the Board on the development of education policy related to affiliation agreements with other post secondary institutions. This agreement is with a high school.
