1. Call to Order The Chair called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm.

4. Chair's Report 4.1 President's Report to Senate

The President's Report to Senate was received.

4.2 Provost Report to Senate

The Provost's updated Senate on his activities in the last month:

 The Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) – Acupuncture Diploma is expected to be presented to Senate in February 2016. KPU has been working with the Ministry of Advanced Education (AVED), the University of British Columbia

- (UBC) and the Faculty of Medicine to explore and construct a distributed clinical model for student clinical work. A revised business plan has been developed and will be delivered to the AVED tomorrow. We continue to plan for the implementation of the program for September 2016.
- The Government of Canada has announced it will act on all the 94
 recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC). The Provost
 has responded on behalf of KPU to two different surveys indicating our institutional
 responses to the relevant issues raised in the TRC's recommendations as they apply
 to post-secondary institutions. The first survey was conducted by AVED and the
 second sought a more national compendium of practices to be collated and
 distributed by Universities Canada.
- The Common Online Application Project continues unabated although with a more constrained scope. The adoption of a full province-wide application system while desirable on many fronts is a huge project requiring much more planning and a graduated approach. In the meantime a front-end portal known as an E-Pass and the ability to implement electronic transcripts will require all BC institutions to become part of Apply BC by 2017.
- The Ministry of Advanced Education's Degree Quality Assessment Board (DQAB) revised terms of reference were approved 27 November by the Minister. The biggest change is the labour market lens that has to be applied to all proposals going to DQAB. Ministry staff very aware of the issues for institutions caught in the "logjam" of approvals, and some discussion about whether institutions need to change their approach in terms of what they put forward for approval.
- KPU is participating with Surrey's DiverseCity on a joint proposal to apply to the Premiers Refugee Readiness Fund to be one of the five Refugee Response Teams in BC, this one being to address the Fraser Valley needs.
- The Provost will be delivering a first draft of the programming plans and facility plans for Three Civic Plaza to the Boards Finance Committee on January 14th. This document will be a compilation and analysis of possibilities based on internal and external discussions. Furthermore, the briefing will form the preliminary basis for upcoming planning with the builders and architects of the facility that is due to open for business in Spring 2017.
- The Office of the Provost has been in continual consultations with the Vice Chair of Senate to ensure new policies, curriculum planning, revised policies and the progressive agenda of course development continues unabated. On the horizon we also have an almost-ready new Field School Guidelines document for consideration by Senate, an emerging Mature Learners plan and the introduction of a Healthy University Framework development process for both students and employees in the new year.

Jennifer Au presented the Full Program Proposal (FPP) for a Certificate in Health Foundations. Questions resulting from Senate's discussion were answered satisfactorily. The Chair commented that the Certificate includes seven courses that could be applied within other Faculties if students do not enter into the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) or the Bachelor of Psychiatric Nursing (BPN). The investigation of alternate education streams for graduates of the Certificate in Health Foundations to move through was encouraged.

- Page 8 of FPP: The course name for PHIL 3010 is incorrect. Change "Bioethics" to "Health Care Ethics".
- Page 8 of FPP and Page 9 of Appendix E (both sides of the table): In Year
 4, Semester 7, specify the acronym and course level that students may take
 for the elective course. For example, "Any 3000 or 4000 level PSYC, SOCI,
 or ACCT".
